

- I. Call to Order @ 6pm.
- II. Roll Call was taken by Activities Director Field
- III. Approval of the Minutes
 - a. Senator Eury moved to approve the minutes, Senator Gaub seconded
- IV. Amendments or Changes to the Agenda
 - a. There were no amendments or changes to the agenda.
- V. New Student Concerns or Comments
 - a. Vice President Tews said that a student had come into the office and asked about the existence of a folf map.
 - i. Nicole Hazelbaker (guest speaker) informed ASUMW that there is one in the Wellness Center
 1. President Snider and Vice President Tews will work to more widely distribute the maps.
 - b. Senator Sekerak informed ASUMW that students had been asking about Monday Night Movies and if there would be a student discount this week or in the future.
 - i. Activities Director Field stated that as long as the Activities budget was approved by ASUMW tonight, the discount for movies would resume next week. There were no 'Monday Night Movies' this week.
- VI. Position Reports
 - a. President
 - i. President Snider passed around an example of a snapchat filter that he created for the first week of school. He also stated that clubs could come to him, pay \$5, and he would create a snapchat filter for them for their events.
 - ii. President Snider informed ASUMW that he had been elected MAS president.
 1. His goals for MAS is better promotion and informing students across the University System what MAS does.
 - b. Vice President
 - i. Vice President Tews Brought up the Welcome Fair, which will be held September 6th, on the Mathews Hall lawn from 10am-1pm.
 1. He asked for volunteers for set-up, serving lunch, manning the ASUMW table and take-down. He made note of those Senators who volunteered.
 - ii. Vice President Tews discussed Lobby Day for the clubs.
 1. Chair Funk came up with the idea of holding the Lobby day on September 11th @ 3:30pm in the SUB Lobby.
 - a. A placard vote was taken and passed unanimously
 - b. Vice President Tews stated that he will be sending out club emails tomorrow (August 29, 2017) informing clubs of Lobby day and the Welcome Fair
 - iii. Vice President Tews stated that Brenden Kirkland, President of Kappa Sigma, came to him with the idea of partnering with ASUMW to host a Color Run prior to the homecoming game.

1. Kirkland explained what a Color Run was to ASUMW. It is essentially a fun run in which bystanders throw water soluble chalk paint onto the runners.
 2. Activities Director Field stated that she had called the city and would need to fill out paperwork ASAP to make that happen. Additionally, she stated some of the potential obstacles that could arise from this event including: low student participation if students were charged, the city's grievances with paint being used on the sidewalks and the cost of the paint.
 - a. President Snider suggested forming a committee to further discuss the idea. They will have a presentation by next Monday.
 - i. The committee consists of Senators Hubbard, Gaub and Eury, Vice president Tews and Activities Director Field.
- c. Advisor
- i. Dr. Hajduk expressed that he has started looking into online voting software and will have some options for ASUMW soon.
- d. Activities
- i. President Snider explained that Tia Seymanski had resigned from her position as Activities Director and that Kelsie Field had stepped into that role.
 - ii. Activities Director Field gave out a budget for Fall 2017. The Senators looked over the document.
 1. Senator Sarrazin expressed that he thought the price set for the Scary Movie Night was too low but Drama Club would go in on it with ASUMW.
 2. Senator Sarrazin moved to approve the activities budget in the amount of \$19,105. Senator Eury seconded.
 - a. A roll call vote was taken and passed unanimously.
 - iii. Activities Director Field asked if there was anyone who would like to do the Weekly Flush and Table Tents as their office hour every week. She stated that they would be completed by 4pm every Friday and that the Senators who volunteered would need to distribute them on Sundays.
 1. Senators Rideg, Eury, Gaub and Letcher volunteered and will work out the division of the task among themselves.
 - iv. Activities Director Field is updating everyone's profiles for the ASUMW board. She asked everyone to fill out the profiles and turn them in tonight (August 28th, 2017)
- e. Intramurals
- i. Intramurals Director Monaco stated that the position is being revamped with all new ideas in order to increase student participation.
 1. This includes starting up a Facebook page and using that Facebook page to survey students and find out what THEY want.

- ii. Intramurals Director Monaco also stated that he is looking into purchasing a Knockerball set.
 - iii. Finally, he stated that at the end of the year, he would like to host a softball tournament in which all the proceeds go to the MJ Simkins Scholarship.
- VII. New Business
- a. MJ Scholarship
 - i. President Snider asked ASUMW if they would like to donate money to the MJ scholarship.
 - 1. Activities Director Field stated that since ASUMW gives out \$250 scholarships, that number may be fitting for a donation.
 - a. Senator Gaub made a motion to donate \$250 to the MJ Scholarship, Senator Neville seconded.
 - i. A roll call vote was taken and passed unanimously
 - b. Swear-in of the Kelsie Field as Activities Director.
 - i. President Snider swore in Kelsie Field as the ASUMW Activities Director.
- VIII. Fulfilling the Promise of X-1
- a. Senator Rideg expressed that Senator Neville and herself had spent some time in the Pryor Mountains studying wild horse behavior.
- IX. Recognition of Accomplishment Across the University
- a. President Snider congratulated everyone for surviving their first day back.
 - b. Chair Funk acknowledged the Football team for their win and the Volleyball team from their 5-2 record.
 - c. Senator Eury stated that the lawn looked awesome.
- X. Announcements
- a. Dean Hazelbaker informed ASUMW that some students had come to her stating that they could not get ahold of Saferide and that the phone's voicemail was not set-up yet.
 - i. She also looked through a few of the club's bylaws and informed ASUMW that they were outdated. She suggested we make a rule about clubs updating their bylaws.
 - 1. Vice President Tews stated that he would include that in the email sent to clubs on August 29, 2017
 - ii. Finally she stated that Regent Greenfield had been by campus earlier in the summer and had requested that more students participate in the Board of Regent's meetings and that we come to MAS and BOR with what ASUMW is doing and what our student concerns are.
